

THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him . . . might have eternal life. (John 3:16)

This verse from the Gospel of John may be the most famous passage in the whole Bible. It's especially appropriate on this feast of the Exaltation of the Cross because it's a concise summary of why the cross of Christ is central to our faith. Let's reflect on it today. Love. "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son" (John 3:16, emphasis added). God is a communion of three Persons, with a love and unity beyond our comprehension. Yet this triune God so desired to share his perfect love with us that the Son of God became a man. Out of that love, Jesus was willing to suffer and die on the cross—all so that he could save us. This love is so immense; it knows no bounds. It will go to any lengths and give everything to bring us into God's loving embrace. Life. "... so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (John 3:16, emphasis added). God never wanted us to die. In Adam, we brought death upon ourselves when we turned away from God and went our own way. But on the cross, Jesus offered himself up as "expiation for our sins" (1 John 2:2). Through the shedding of his blood, Jesus conquered sin and death for everyone. This means that we can begin to experience eternal life even now. We don't have to be slaves to sin, and we don't have to fear death! When we do sin, the Holy Spirit can assure us of God's mercy and forgiveness. And now, we can look forward in hope to life everlasting in his presence. Love and life: this is the message of the cross. Today at Mass, gaze at the cross, and thank God for all that he has done for you in Christ Jesus, your Lord!

September is dedicated to Our Lady of Sorrows

Do you know what the Seven Sorrows of Mary are? These are moments of deep suffering in Mary's life that help us reflect on her strength, faith, and compassion. They include:

- 1. Simeon telling Mary that Jesus would suffer.
- 2. Escaping to Egypt to live as refugees, to protect Jesus from King Herod.
- 3. Losing 12-year-old Jesus for three days, only to find Him teaching in the temple.
- 4. Seeing Jesus carry His cross on the way to His crucifixion.
- 5. Watching Jesus suffer and die on the cross.
- 6. Holding her lifeless Son after He is taken down from the cross.
- 7. Watching Jesus be buried in the tomb. Through these sorrows, Mary draws near to all who suffer. May we turn to her in our own times of grief and find peace and comfort in her loving, maternal heart.
