A note from Father:

The recent released Diocesan report paints a discouraging picture for our Diocese, our parishes and our schools, but why?

Every one of us has had to face difficult times, and while we keep looking for an easy solution, usually there was no instant answer that would solve our problem. That then means that we must suffer and work even harder for the desired outcome that we want. So what do we want? If we want everything to stay the way it is, then we are living a fantasy.

Everyday things are changing, people die and are born. Nothing stays 100% static. Let us look at our ancestors, in building St. John the Baptist and Our Lady of Mercy Churches; did they have to suffer and sacrifice to build the legacy that we live in? Yes. Our ancestors gave of themselves because they had a dream of a better tomorrow rooted in the faith they shared.

Now what does the report tell us. It tells us that we have a lot of work to do. This is not just a financial issue; it is a people issue. We need to invite all, fallen away Catholic, unchurched, neighbors and friends to come and experience the joy that we have in living out a Sacramental life in our Church communities. If we do not desire to grow our communities, then the future that the report described will come about, and we can start asking ourselves, "When do we need to close..."

To me the report states that there are issues beyond my control that I simply have to live with, but there is a lot that I can do. This doing begins with not being negative. Our communities must continue to work hard, and to invite, and to celebrate the gift that we have. Yes, none of us can control the future, but we can control how we let the future control our outlook. Our Hope is in Jesus Christ, for without him we all would be dead in sin, and hopeless in life.
