

HIGHS AND LOWS

The two Gospel readings today can give us an emotional whiplash. As Mass begins, we hear the story of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. We may even wave our own palm branches and join the crowd in shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Mark 11:9). Then, in the Liturgy of the Word, we hear Mark's passion account. Once again, we join our voices with the crowd—but this time, we cry out, "Crucify him!" (15:13). How jarring! Why does the Church have us play a role in both of these readings as we begin Holy Week? It's all for one purpose: so that we can grasp more fully what Jesus did for the crowds back then—and for us. As we will see throughout Holy Week, he accepted the suffering set before him and freely offered himself for his people, regardless of how they responded. Whether they acclaimed or condemned him, he loved them just the same. And that's how he loves us. Jesus is not put off by our fickleness. That's good news! Because if we're honest, we can all recognize times when our own commitment to the Lord and our love for him has wavered. When life is going well, it's not so hard to praise him. But it can be another story altogether when danger threatens or sadness darkens our outlook. So allow these passages to motivate you to pay attention to this final week in Christ's life. Acknowledge the inconstancy of your own love for Jesus and ask him to strengthen you. But don't stop there! Open your heart to the liberating truth that Jesus loves you even when you stray. Look at the cross and believe that he held you close to his heart throughout his passion, death, and resurrection. May the Lord pour out graces on us all during this most holy week of the year!

March 17, 2024 St. Patrick/5th Sunday of Lent

Dear Parishioners:

Last month, I published a video discussing the situation in the Diocese of Steubenville. I would like to re-emphasize that message here today.

In the brief time I have been here, I have grown to love the generous, faithful people here in the Diocese of Steubenville. I am so honored to be your bishop. Even during this time of uncertainty, as our Diocese is being examined to determine our future viability as an independent Local Church, our priests and people continue to focus our primary attention on our Faith lives and advancing the mission of the Church.

Though the Holy Father has asked me to be here "temporarily" until that determination has been made, I have been assured many times that there is no foregone conclusion to this process. That means that we must continue to maintain the strength and vitality of our Diocese to the absolute best of our ability.

One of the most distressing "low points" of our recent history had to do with serious financial mismanagement, which brought a halt to the Cathedral Renovation project, and which has resulted, understandably, in a loss of trust and respect by many within the Body of Christ in our Diocese. I truly apologize, in the name of the Church, for the hurt, pain, and sense of betrayal you experienced because of that sinful and illegal activity.

I want to assure you that the problems with financial mismanagement have been corrected, and that the proper "checks and balances" have been put into place to ensure that this never happens again. Furthermore, new efforts at financial transparency have been implemented as evidenced by the complete financial audits being published on the diocesan website for everyone's review. (Visit www.diosteub.org and click on "Diocesan Financial Audits").

As we go through this "discernment period" in our Diocese's history and are uncertain what the outcome of that process will be, there may very well be a mindset among many of our people to not support the DPSC; to wait and see, or to donate your charitable support elsewhere. However, if that takes place, wouldn't that contribute to the classic "self-fulfilling prophecy," giving evidence that our Diocese is unable to sustain itself financially?

I take this occasion to ask you to do just the opposite. I ask you to **show your support**—both financially and prayerfully—and to be **actively engaged** in the practice of your Faith! I ask this of you primarily because it is essential for each of our spiritual lives to do so, but also because it will give actual and tangible evidence that our Diocese is a strong and vibrant Local Church—spiritually, temporally, and charitably—one that can continue to thrive and faithfully further the mission of the Church, the Body of Christ that is truly One, by proclaiming and living the Gospel of Jesus Christ in all that we do, and to all those we serve in His Name.

The DPSC provides essential funding for our diocesan budget. Please keep in mind that all funds received through the DPSC are donor restricted and will remain in the diocese of Steubenville to serve our Local Church.

May the Immaculate Heart of Mary, our Mother, continue to intercede for all of us, and inspire us all to do what she asks of each of us: to love her Son Jesus and His Holy Church.
