DEAR FRIENDS IN CHRIST: Issue 1

On July 12th, a meeting with all the priests of the Diocese about the upcoming ballot issue on abortion in Ohio. This meeting strictly focused on our mandate as Catholics to protect Life. In this meeting there were presentations about Issue 1 which we will be asked to vote on August 8, and the voting issue on the November ballot that would legalize abortion for all 9 months of pregnancy with **no parental consent or notification**. If this issue passes, it was communicated that children will also be able to begin to gender transition without parental consent. It is important as Catholics that we make a stand. The August 8 special election will have one issue only. It is a proposed Ohio Constitution amendment to require a 60% + 1 vote to amend the Constitution. As it stands now, the Ohio Constitution can be amended with only 50% + 1 vote. The speakers at the meeting communicated that if Issue 1 does not pass, it is likely that the abortion issue will pass in November, and that there could be more radical ballot initiatives to follow. I encourage everyone to research and to vote on issue 1. Pope Francis reminds us that we are called to bring Jesus everywhere: "An authentic faith . . . always involves a deep desire to change the world, to transmit values, to leave this earth somehow better than we found it." The dignity of life in its earliest stages is threatened by the proposed Ohio Constitutional amendment, to be voted on in the November 7th election, attempting to expand and enshrine abortion at the expense of protection for preborn children and women. As Catholics, we cannot remain on the sidelines when confronted with such a clear threat to human life. Please review all the resources on numerous platforms, including the Catholic Conference of Ohio, which is the official voice of the Catholic Church in Ohio on matters of public policy. This conference is working diligently with the dioceses across Ohio to equip Catholics with the resources necessary to learn about the proposed amendment and take action to oppose it in November 2023, https://www.ohiocathconf.com.
