



Catholic Opposition to the Proposed Constitutional Amendment in Ohio

On February 28, 2023, the Catholic Bishops of Ohio issued a letter about the proposed amendment to Ohio's Constitution on abortion. They wrote: "In Ohio, the dignity of life in its earliest stages is threatened by groups proposing an amendment to Ohio's Constitution for the November 2023 ballot that would enshrine and expand abortion at the expense of protections for preborn children and women. The Church must not be silent and cannot remain on the sidelines when confronted with such a clear threat to human life. This proposal demands a response, and we strongly encourage Catholics and all people of good will in Ohio to work against including the proposed amendment for the November ballot and, if it appears on the ballot, vote against the amendment to prevent countless deaths of preborn, innocent children."
