It is the responsibility of the family/grave owner to remove any flowers after burial. Also, please remove grave blankets after the holidays, since they can kill the grass if left on the grave for a long period of time. This helps us with the care of the cemetery and makes for a neat appearance.
- 2) No glass containers are to be used for flowers.
- 3) Reminder of the cemetery rule that there is to be **no permanent planting of flowers and shrubs.**OLM Cemetery is not responsible for damage done to plants/shrubs planted without permission, nor are we responsible for missing arrangements.
 On occasion, we receive high winds which scatter artificial arrangements over the property. We are unable to tend to these items.
